Lectionary readings for the Fourth Sunday of Advent December 22, 2024

Micah 5:2-5a Psalm 80

<u>Hebrews 10:5-10</u> <u>Luke 1:39-55</u>

As we lean into these lengthening nights, hopeful expectation meets our griefs. It is natural to look back over the year with a mixture of frustration, sadness, satisfaction, and joy. We are complex enough creatures to hold these competing feelings in tension. The cold and dark invite us to slow down, look within, and deepen our spiritual awareness. There's wisdom in how creation waits out the winter. May yours be generative and sweet.

Looking back, notice where you were comforted, where a relationship was nurtured, and where you grew from a challenge or mistake. Give thanks because some mistakes are the best way to learn and pain often teaches us about our resilience and who will stand by us even when we are wrong. No matter what, know that your church is with you.

Unlike the cultural New Year which begins with resolutions and setting goals, the Christian New Year arrives with the gentle anticipation of Advent; like waiting for a baby. It comes with prayers for dignity, health, reverence, and community. For justice and freedom. With Mary's song, the Magnificat, we expect systems of violence to end because of God's redemptive work in our world. Our role requires us to weave webs of love for that to happen.

The future-oriented vision at Christmas reminds us that we must raise children in love. And, like Mary, we need our minds open to learning from them and helping them lead.

In that vein, I was delighted to hear that Central Church raised over \$1,300 for people in Skokie living with food insecurity. You are light bearers, friends. The gift of giving in the name of our Generous God is alive and well.

What other rhythms of care does the Christ child ask of us? May we meet Jesus in holy awe.

One more Sunday of Advent, and then Merry Christmas Beloved! Enjoy all twelve days of Christmastide; slow down, rest, connect to those you love. And remember the gift of those whose eternal life is in God's hands.

Tuesday Morning Meditation



Weekly on Tuesday Log Cabin & Online 10:30 AM

Join us as we gather to practice Lectio divina on the weekly lectionary readings.

Lectio divina is a contemplative practice with its Christian roots in the Benedictine tradition. It combines slow, conscious reading of a biblical or sacred text with contemplation and silent prayer. It is meant to promote communication with God and a deeper knowledge of Christ, in our lives today.

During Lectio Divina we put aside thoughts of studying the text. This is not the time to consider the historical or theological meanings of what we are reading. We read with a willingness to enter into text in a felt sense. The purpose of this practice is to hear, in silence, the word of God, in this moment. What, through this reading, is God saying to me right now? What do I hear that helps me know what it means to walk the Christ path today?

Lectio Divina has traditionally been a communal practice; that is, one shared when in a group but it can be done when alone.

Spiritual gifts are not our talents or skills. They are the grace of God at


work within us, empowering us to match our deep passions with the world's deep need. The gifts are given to individuals, but they are given to build and strengthen community and to meet the needs of those around us.
